SESSION 2

WHAT SIN DOES TO MY FRIENDSHIP WITH GOD

**"All have turned away from God; all have gone wrong.
No one does good, not even one." Romans 3:12**

The Good News is that God wants to be our friend! The sad truth is that because of sin, we have broken our friendship with God. So how did sin enter into the perfect world God created for Adam and Eve?

God gave Adam and Eve a wonderful gift. It was the ability to make the choice to obey God. None of the animals or anything else God made had that wonderful choice. God gave Adam and Eve just one rule to live by. All they had to do was to show God how much they loved him by choosing to obey his one rule. One sad day, Adam and Eve chose to disobey God. Choosing to disobey God is called sin. God is holy, which means he is pure and perfect in every way.

Because God loves us so much he has given us rules in the Bible that will help us live in ways which please him. These rules will make our life happier and so much better. God knows the best thing for us to do is choose to obey him. The world, however, has a sad big lie for us. It says that we can each decide for ourselves what is right or wrong for us. We often get tempted to think that what is right or wrong really depends on what is happening or what we think would be the best thing to do at the moment. But what God says is more important than what we think.

He really made Bill feel bad, and he talked about it to everyone in the classroom. Even though Bill promised he had not even seen Brandon's book, everyone thought he had it. That night, Brandon found his spelling book in his own bedroom.

The next day, Brandon did not say anything about it. He thought it would make him look bad if he told Bill and the others the truth, that he had left his spelling book at home.

2. Melissa goes to church every Sunday. She has learned that God loves her. She feels that she is special to God. Last week she turned 10 years old. She and a few friends were going to the city zoo. Her mother had given her \$20 to pay for her admission to the zoo and to have extra spending money. At the gate she saw that the children under 10 only had to pay \$2, while those 10 and over had to pay \$5 to get in. She knew most of her girlfriends had not turned 10 yet, so it would not be a problem for her to quietly tell the attendant she was under 10. Then she could have an extra \$3 to spend. After all, the Bible teaches us that God wants to forgive us of all our sins.

SESSION 3

LOST AND ALONE BECAUSE OF SIN

“For all have sinned; all fall short of God’s glorious standard.” Romans 3:23

“For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life through Christ Jesus our Lord.” Romans 6:23

Today we are going to learn how sin affects us.

We are all tempted to sin. Sometimes we disobey God because it just seems to be the easiest thing to do at the moment. There are other times that we sin because we want other kids to like us. There are even times that we sin because we think we can get by with it. No matter why we have made the wrong choice, sin always leaves us feeling lost and alone—away from God.

Some people think, “Well, it’s my life; I can choose what I want to do. This bad attitude says that what God wants for us is not important. There is a selfishness deep in our hearts that makes us want to do things our own way. This selfish attitude is resistance toward God.


The first step in making things right with God is to:

Read (or have a camper read) 1 Corinthians 2:13

Say: "Can you help Randy, Kim, and Carlos think of a way they can escape their temptation? All three of these kids go to church and will tell you they love Jesus, but they are each tempted to do what they know they should not do." Read the three scenarios and discuss how each can escape temptation.

A. Randy has great friends at church, but only one of them is in his class at school. He is very outgoing and likes to be in the "in" crowd. The one boy in his class at both school and church is not really in with the cool kids. When Randy is with his church friends, he does okay, but he is unsure of himself with his school friends. He really wants to impress his school friends with how cool he is. The guys in the group he runs with often tell jokes that make him feel uncomfortable. He knows that the words they are saying displease God and would not please his parents. But he really wants to hang around and hear the jokes. He is so afraid of what the other guys would think if they knew how he felt, so he tries to laugh and play along. It is just so tempting to join in.

What is Randy's way of escape?

B. Kim is smart and can make good grades. She really likes to study and wants to always make A's. She becomes so upset if she gets a B. One day, while helping her teacher out, she found where the teacher kept the test that she was planning to give on Friday. Kim slipped a copy of the test out quickly, and she was able to study with it. When she took the test in class, it was very easy for her because she had already worked it out. When she got a perfect score and then got by with it, she was thrilled. Unfortunately, she has developed a habit of snooping around the teacher's desk and watching carefully where the teacher puts things. Taking another test almost seems like a game. It would be so tempting.

C. Carlos really loves his parents very much but he thinks they have too many rules for him. His parents pay for his school lunches ahead of time so that he will not have to carry money to school each day. Deep down inside Carlos knows his parents are doing the right thing, but he wants the stuff some of his friends are eating. He has thought of talking to his parents about his feelings, but then he discovered a large jar, where his parents drop change, in their bedroom closet. Carlos is careful to not get caught but for the last two weeks, almost daily he has been able to buy something from the vending machines. He knows he should stop this behavior, but it is just too tempting.

I CAN BE FORGIVEN

"For God sent Jesus to take the punishment for our sins and to satisfy God's anger against us. We are made right with God when we believe that Jesus shed his blood, sacrificing his life for us. God was being entirely fair and just when he did not punish those who had sinned in former times."

Romans 3:25

The best news you will ever hear is that you can be forgiven of your sin. God wants to be your friend, but your sin separates you from God. The wrong things you do break God's laws and hurt the people God loves. It breaks God's heart that your sin has separated you from him. Your sin is the problem.

God solved our problem with sin through Jesus' death on the cross. God accepts Jesus' death as the payment for all our sins. There is nothing that you or I can do to earn our own way into heaven or gain a friendship with God.

You can be forgiven by trusting that Jesus died for you. You can ask God to forgive you and he will because Jesus paid for your sins with his own life. By trusting in Jesus as your Savior you will have a friendship with God forever.

WHY? WHAT DOES THE BIBLE SAY?

Acts 4:12 says, "There is salvation in no one else; there is no other name in all of heaven for people to call on to save them."

Roman 3: 22-23 says, "We are made right in God's sight when we trust in Jesus Christ to take away our sins. And we all can be saved in this same way, no matter who we are or what we have done. For all have sinned; all fall short of God's glorious standard."

Romans 5:8 says, "But God showed his great love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still sinners."

I CAN BE SURE JESUS WILL ALWAYS LOVE ME

Did you know that God loves you just like you are? It is true. There is nothing that you can do to make God love you more.
